Gitxaala's win at the B.C. Supreme Court in 2023 means B.C. will no longer allow corporations to stake mining claims in Indigenous territory without consultation with Indigenous Peoples. Gitxaala Nation is now pushing the court to uphold Free, Prior, and Informed consent, and ensure the DRIPA Act is justiciable.

The mountains, wetlands, lakes, rivers, and ocean waters of Banks Island, on British Columbia's north coast, are a rich nursery of marine and terrestrial life that has sustained the Gitxaala economy and culture for generations and which the community still relies heavily on today. In 2015, an illegal discharge of tailings from the Yellow Giant gold mine devastated Banks Island's salmon-rich creeks and near-shore areas. The company quickly went bankrupt and the mess was left to Gitxaala. As a result, Gitxaala called for an end to mining activities on Banks Island and brought B.C. to court to stop allowing mining claims to be staked without consultation. Gitxaala is heading to the B.C. Court of Appeal to ensure that B.C.'s DRIPA has teeth that can hold the province to account when laws are found to be in violation of UNDRIP.
