Since time immemorial, the Wet'suwet'en have been stewarding and protecting their territories. Now, a group are defending land, air, and water for all of us with a historic and sweeping climate justice challenge. Launched in February 2020, the legal action by two Likhts'amisyu Clan Houses is a challenge asking the Federal Court to declare that Canada has a constitutional duty to keep the country's greenhouse gas emissions consistent with the Paris Agreement global warming limit. The claim is focused on the inability of House members to safely and healthily live in their territories and practice their culture and way of life in a world threatened by climate change. The claim focuses on the Charter right – guaranteed to every citizen – to life, liberty, and security of the person. This would be the first time in Canada, and perhaps the world, that a trial would decide on a climate claim brought by plaintiffs constituted under their own Indigenous laws.
